- Items may be reused.
- Remove batteries if possible and recycle at battery recyclers such as Battery World.

## Electronic Waste Recycling

E-waste is now growing three times faster than other waste streams. By recycling your television and computer 'e-waste' you are keeping toxic materials out of landfill and ensuring valuable resources are reused, and kept in the 'circular economy'.

E-waste contains large amounts of non-renewable resources such as plastic and precious metals including gold, silver, platinum, nickel, zinc, aluminium and copper. Fortunately, more than 90% of computer and TV components can be recovered and recycled. From 2016-17, 50% of discarded TVs and computers were recycled—a 40% improvement from a decade ago.

At Kurrajong Recycling your e-waste is manually disassembled, sorted into its various components and materials, and sold into the recycling market.

Most of our disassembled e-waste is taken to Melbourne. Cabling, circuit boards, glass, metals and plastics are then processed for use as raw materials in new products.

Our 'bottom line' is affected by the cost of taking to landfill the non-recyclable e-waste delivered to our facility (\$145/tonne). Please only drop-off e-waste we can recycle at your council's collection site.

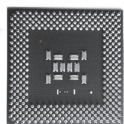

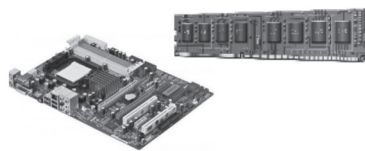

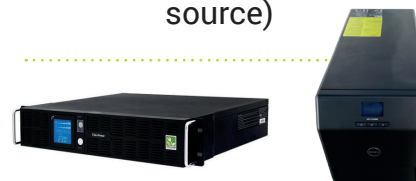
