Chairman s REPORT



I am delighted to share my Chairman's report for 2024.

Reflecting on my first year as Chairman, I can honestly say it's been both enjoyable and rewarding. It's been a privilege to witness the many accomplishments and successes of Kurrajong as we continue our objective to provide top-quality services to our clients and their families.

As you know, the Board carries a significant responsibility in overseeing the governance, management and strategic direction of our organisation. We are here to ensure that Kurrajong not only meets but exceeds its goals and objectives. This responsibility isn't something we take lightly.

I'm pleased to say that our Board is made up of individuals with diverse skill sets, working closely with our CEO to steer the organisation toward achieving its strategic goals. We have also kept a close oversight on the operational and financial health of Kurrajong, making sure we uphold a strong ethical foundation in all our activities and decisions with our stakeholders' best interests always in mind. One of our key roles has been to identify the main risks facing our organisation and ensure that we have effective control and monitoring systems in place to manage and mitigate those risks.

Our NDIS re-registration audit was conducted in March by external consultants. The results of the audit were very pleasing with no findings of major or minor non-conformities. In fact, 33 quality indicators rated as Best Practice which was an excellent outcome clearly indicating that the auditor believed these quality indicators to be new and innovative approaches. Best Practice is demonstrated through innovative, responsive service delivery underpinned by the principles of continuous improvements of Kurrajong's systems.

Our commitment to continuous improvement is unwavering. We have remained focused on maintaining quality management and safety across all our services and businesses while advancing our Strategic Workforce Plan, Technology Roadmap and Marketing and Communication strategies.

One of the tougher decisions we made this year was to discontinue the annual Kurrajong Race Day after 34 years. While it wasn't an easy decision we believe it was the right decision. We are now in a position to promote Hildasid Farm as a community accessible destination. We felt it was the ideal time for our donors, sponsors and supporters to redirect their support to Hildasid Farm to ensure ongoing improvements for the benefit and enjoyment of the community and remain a place of enjoyment for all.

In terms of support of Kurrajong, I would like to express our sincere gratitude to our tremendous donors and sponsors. Their ongoing commitment over many years to Kurrajong's services and now more specifically toward Hildasid Farm has been invaluable and we truly appreciate everything you do for Kurrajong – thank you.

Despite the challenges posed by continued inadequate annual NDIS price increases amidst rising costs, Kurrajong's financial health remains very strong with income of \$66.06M and a surplus of \$2.06M for the year. Net assets increased from \$47.1 million to \$49.1M.

While our client numbers saw a slight decrease from 1,211 in June 2023 to 1,165 in June 2024, mainly due to recruitment challenges in Therapy Plus, the number of services delivered per client has remained steady which is a positive outcome.

We've continued to make significant progress on our 2022-2025 Strategic Plan particularly focusing on our three key strategies.

These strategies are vital for Kurrajong's growth and continued excellence ensuring we remain an organisation that our clients, families, staff and external stakeholders can be proud of.

The Board has also ensured that all statutory compliance requirements, systems and processes are in place to monitor and control the organisation's activities. We have an excellent Board and every Director contributed significantly throughout the year with their advice and support. Your dedication and commitment to Kurrajong is greatly appreciated.

I also want to acknowledge the ongoing contributions of our various Subcommittees. Every Director plays a part in one or sometimes two Subcommittees and I'd like to thank everyone involved particularly our independent volunteer members for their valuable time and expertise.

Finally, I'd like to extend my thanks and appreciation to my fellow Directors and our CEO, Ray Carroll for their support, especially during my first year as Chairman. I also want to express my appreciation to our outstanding General Managers, Managers and staff for their excellent work throughout the year.

The majority of our revenue continues to be derived from the NDIS to support our core business, accounting for 79% of total revenue. Commercial enterprises performed solidly and contributed 14%, with interest income continuing to be strong as interest rates remained at higher levels.

Our expenditures increased by 11% to \$64M, due to higher staff expenses, which rose 10.5%. Rising costs across all areas of the business have become an anticipated challenge. In response, the company has maintained a strong focus on cost management, driving efficiencies, and optimising value in its commercial arrangements.

The recent NDIS Annual Pricing review announced a 3.19% increase in pricing for some, but not all, of Kurrajong's services. Key areas, such as Support Co-ordination, Plan Management, and our Therapy Services, continue to be denied any increase. While appreciative of the increase we did receive, it fails to recognise the 3.75% increase in the National Wage decision or reflect the growth in other operational costs such as insurance, rent, and utilities. This continual cost squeeze is of great concern to the disability industry. However, Kurrajong's diversified business model positions the company to navigate these challenging operating conditions.

The next twelve months will see Kurrajong focus on completing its strategic plan and continued investments in technology, facilities, and plant and equipment to improve efficiency and cost savings further. It is expected that most of the Deniliquin subdivision blocks will be sold over the next 12 months. Significant capital expenditure planned for 2025 includes facility improvements at Lord Baden Powell Drive, the completion of 3 x 3 bedroom units in Inglis St, Wagga Wagga, and the re-establishment of the Narrandera laundry.

Thank you to our Finance and administration teams' dedication, particularly to our Finance and Administration Manager, Sharyn Atherton. They have consistently delivered top-tier financial, accounting, and payroll services to all our business and service units. Although this can be a thankless task, it is reassuring to know that we have experienced and capable staff ready to manage this business-critical function.


It is my privilege to present the Treasurer's report for Kurrajong, highlighting yet another year of significant achievement.


Despite continual cost pressures, Kurrajong has reported a solid net surplus of \$2.056M for the year.

Our total income increased by 13% from the previous year, reaching \$66.060M. This growth was primarily driven by increased income from the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), but also profit from selling Gralee School and other assets, unit sales at Rosebank Retirement Village, and higher interest income.

Chief Executive Officer's REPORT

Lifestyle Choices in Wagga Wagga has seen a vibrant and diverse range of activities. We've strengthened our connection with Disability Sports Australia incorporating sports sessions like cricket, netball and soccer at the Equex Centre. Our clients were also given the opportunity to attend the In-Motion contemporary dance performance at the Civic Theatre and they enjoyed several bike riding outings with Cycling Without Age. In celebration of five wonderful years at our Hildasid Farm location we hosted a lively dance party. Additionally, we supported our clients on an exciting trip to Questacon, enriching their experiences with new and stimulating activities.

In Griffith, Lifestyle Choices underwent a significant transformation with the relocation of our Middleton Street service to 123 Banna Avenue. This move has centralised all our services making them more accessible and convenient for our clients.

Narrandera was a hub of creativity this year as our clients from Leeton, Narrandera and Griffith took to the stage in the drama performance "When Juliet met Johnny," held at the Plaza Theatre. The production, spread over two nights, was a fantastic success and we eagerly anticipate what they will bring to the stage next.

Meanwhile, in West Wyalong, our programs continued to thrive offering clients a range of engaging activities such as morning tea outings, sports, shopping trips, art and craft sessions, puzzles, karaoke and music.

In Deniliquin, we began transforming an unused outdoor area at Napier Street into an accessible and welcoming space. The addition of fencing and artificial turf has already made a significant impact and we are currently working on further landscaping and installing accessible equipment.

Supported Living

Supported Living has been marked by growth and development across several areas. This year, we purchased two new group homes—one in Strickland Drive in Wagga Wagga and another in Elwin Street in Narrandera.

In Wagga Wagga, we received approval for the Development Application to refurbish the old Skills Options building at our Lord Baden Powell Drive site which will soon provide new office space for our operations. Additionally, we made progress on the Inglis Street, Lake Albert development which will result in three, three-bedroom purpose-built units for people with disability.

The introduction of a new Client Care Coordinator position in Wagga Wagga has been incredibly beneficial allowing us to better support participants in managing their diverse needs. Our Supported Independent Living, Short-term Accommodation (STA), Social Connections and Drop-in Support services continued to deliver high-quality care across Wagga Wagga, Leeton, Narrandera, Deniliquin and West Wyalong.

In Deniliquin, we received a generous donation of over \$15,000 from the Rotary Club of Deniliquin - Truck Show and Deniliquin & District Wall of Fame. This funding enabled us to purchase and install a much-needed ceiling hoist at the Napier Street Centre dramatically improving comfort and safety for both clients and staff.

Finally, the Kurrajong Estate subdivision in Deniliquin is nearing completion whereby 27 residential blocks will be sold and two blocks kept by Kurrajong for future development of supported accommodation houses and units.

First Contact

First Contact has experienced significant growth this year. Our team now consists of 45 dedicated staff

members including First Contact Representatives, NDIS Plan Administrators, Support Coordinators, Plan Managers and Employment Preparation staff all working together to support clients across the Riverina and Murray regions and beyond. We are also proud to employ four supported staff members — three in Wagga Wagga and one in Griffith.

Throughout the 2024 financial year we successfully implementing approximately 2,100 NDIS Plans and amendments ensuring our clients receive the support they need.

Our Support Coordination team has expanded to 11 staff who now provide support to 371 clients across 44 locations in NSW, VIC, QLD and NT including one coordinator who works remotely in Western Australia. In total, the team delivered almost 16,000 hours of support making a significant impact on the lives of our clients.

Plan Management also saw steady growth with four full-time staff members now managing plans for 533 clients. Both the Support Coordination and Plan Management teams have fully transitioned to our new Client Management System with the Employment Preparation function also in the process of transitioning.

The Employment Preparation team has had an outstanding year expanding to support 59 clients in Wagga Wagga and 19 in Griffith. Over the past 12 months 13 clients successfully gained employment with two more continuing to receive support in their ongoing roles. These outcomes are particularly impressive with 34% of clients in Wagga Wagga and 21% in Griffith achieving their employment goals. We also collaborated with 26 local businesses to arrange employment opportunities and work placements and we are incredibly grateful for their partnership in making a difference in so many lives.

Therapy Plus

Therapy Plus has continued to evolve this year with a strong focus on refining our processes and implementing clearer service pathways to better support clients and families on their NDIS journey. Our school preparation and social learning groups have grown with weekly sessions in Wagga Wagga that provide children with foundational skills for school success. These tailored groups have been instrumental in building confidence and encouraging participation with our Educators working closely with local schools and families during the transition process.

We have also developed strong relationships with several external service providers enabling us to offer more comprehensive support to families navigating the NDIS process. The sharing of knowledge and building of connections has been very beneficial for both our staff and clients.

Therapy Plus continues to serve outreach communities like Hay and Tumbarumba, with fortnightly visits supporting children, families, Early Learning Services and schools.

This year, our staff have also had the opportunity to become trauma-informed which has been beneficial for both the children we support and our team members. Additional wellbeing training has further equipped our staff to be at their best when supporting families ensuring that we continue to deliver high-quality care and support.

Kurrajong Commercial Enterprises

Kurrajong Commercial Enterprises has had a dynamic year marked by both challenges and achievements. Our team's dedication to improving our businesses and providing meaningful employment for our clients remains unwavering. It's heartening to see the enthusiasm our staff bring to their roles and the positive atmosphere across our locations. While we've faced some obstacles, we've made significant progress and look forward to further improvement across all businesses.

Kurrajong Timber has made notable improvements this year investing in new equipment to enhance safety, efficiency and employee comfort. We have upgraded our office, lunchroom and staff amenities with new heating and cooling systems as part of our broader modernisation efforts. Additionally, new fencing and electric gates have been installed to bolster site security and aesthetics.

We have also acquired a new peg pointer saw which improves our ability to produce pegs and stakes efficiently and purchased a new kindling splitter to meet growing demand for our popular kindling products.

Business conditions have been mixed. While the government contract sector remains strong with our materials contributing to major Riverina projects we have observed a slowdown in the private sector and home construction. Despite this, we're optimistic that market conditions will improve in 2025.

Following the retirement of several long-term employees we are looking to expand our team to be well-prepared for future opportunities. Our people

continue to uphold high standards of quality and their contributions are central to our success.

Kurrajong Recycling has seen considerable change including management appointments with a new

Recycling Manager and a Senior Supervisor in the MRF commencing – I am pleased to say that both are doing an excellent job.

This year has seen a renewed focus on staff recruitment, performance and retention leading to a more cohesive and stable team. Our commitment to supporting and nurturing our Supported Employees has strengthened creating a more positive work environment.

Recycling volumes from the six council areas we service have continued to grow and we have developed new business relationships to ensure a steady market for recyclables. Our MRF processed an additional 2.366 tonnes of product from Bega Shire Council contributing positively to our financial results for 2024.

In July 2023 we faced a challenge with our Container Outreach Commercial Enterprises Deposit Scheme (CDS) operation where external contamination led to over 400 tonnes of PET product on-site. Through effective staff recruitment and training we managed to re-process and clear the contaminated product showcasing the resilience and effectiveness of our team.

The E-Waste sector, despite challenges saw improvements with a new partnership with Sircel allowing us to move over 128 tonnes of E-Waste between February and June 2024. This partnership positions us well to accept new stock and continue providing employment opportunities.

Our security shredding and cardboard collection services have been busier than ever with a new truck added to our fleet in September 2023. This addition has energised our team and supported our operations.

Narrandera Laundry faced a significant setback with a fire on 30th May this year which destroyed the facility. The cause appeared to be an electrical fault and we have now demolished the damaged building. Despite this setback our staff's dedication ensured minimal customer loss and I would like to extend my thanks and appreciation to our wonderful staff who got on with the job despite the significance and nature of the situation.

Pleasingly, we have acquired a new building in Narrandera for a larger more modern and efficient laundry. New washing, drying and pressing equipment will enhance our quality of service and enable the business to grow with new customers.



Property Services Wagga Wagga has maintained numerous Kurrajong sites carrying out lawn mowing, maintenance tasks, cleaning services and managing our extensive vehicle fleet.

Catering Wagga Wagga has continued to grow and are looking forward to the renovation of their building within the next year. We currently produce approximately 1,000 biscuits and over 700 sandwiches per month plus our catering services are in high demand. Our website now features our product and price lists making it easier for customers to place orders.

Positive feedback in our Employee Satisfaction Focus Group Responses 2023 reflects our ongoing efforts to support our staff. The monthly barbecue and Employee of the Month award remain highlights for our team providing opportunities to show our appreciation and celebrate their hard work.

Leeton Laundry, operating three days a week, continues to excel handling up to 60 baskets of ironing weekly. Their support for the Narrandera Laundry has been invaluable and we appreciate the team's fantastic assistance during this tough time thank you.

Narrandera Recycling has experienced a slight decrease in activity and staff changes. Thank you to the staff for their contributions who have made positive changes in the shed's operations. Cardboard supply remains steady and kindling sales have been strong due to a colder winter.

West Wyalong Recycling has been active in cardboard recycling, lawn mowing and kindling production. We are seeking additional cardboard sources to replace a reduced supply and anticipate resuming lawn mowing as the weather improves.

Deniliquin Property Services continues to excel in garden and lawn maintenance, kindling production, security shredding and car cleaning. Despite a competitive market we have maintained and expanded our customer base. Kindling sales are expected to increase with a new supply source from Kurrajong Timber.

Deniliquin Catering and Divine Foods biscuits remain popular with EFTPOS capabilities boosting sales particularly in Finley and the Deniliquin High School. Our biscuit gift boxes are now a year-round offering

Kurrajong Café, operating from the TAFE Canteen has had a successful year especially with the addition of a Friday biscuit run to Deniliquin High School mentioned above. Our café continues to provide healthy and delicious options to the TAFE community.

Corporate Services

Over the past 12 months, the Corporate Services Team has focused on enhancing technology, processes, policies and practices. A key achievement was implementing the Client Connect Project, replacing our NDIS management software and further integrating our Customer Management System. This initiative allowed thorough reviews across business units leading to greater efficiencies and higher standards of care and support.

Our Quality and Safeguards team has had a primary focus on the triennial NDIS Registration Audit resulting in full compliance and positive feedback. Independent auditors praised Kurrajong for its strong management systems and commitment to high standards. Preparing for this audit involved reviewing policies and documents to ensure clarity, transparency and contemporary practice. The also ensures compliance with NDIS Practice Standards and other regulatory requirements navigating constant changes from the NDIS Review and Disability Royal Commission. We proactively secure expert assistance to maintain robust systems and focus on continuous improvement for the best client outcomes.

Our Risk Coordinator collaborated with staff to design and implement an Emergency Response Plan for every site earning a Best Practice rating in the NDIS audit. Continuous improvements in our Risk Framework help the Board and staff better understand and mitigate risks while exploring opportunities to grow our services.

Our Kurrajong Health Advisor continues to provide excellent training and guidance in health care, including mentoring, competency assessment and internal procedure monitoring. Our high-intensity daily supports were also highly regarded in the NDIS audit.

Our Marketing team has significantly grown Kurrajong's online presence, supporting business goals through an expanded content strategy. We continue to execute our Digital and Retention Strategy and explore new marketing plans including potential website updates. Increased engagement with schools and community groups has highlighted the importance of recycling and improved online tools have streamlined donations by boosting contributions through the website.

Our People and Culture team has focused on Work, Health and Safety (WHS), reinvigorating the WHS committee with new members, quarterly meetings and enhanced training. This commitment has led to a safer workplace. We have also improved the return-to-work process, reducing workplace injuries and expediting staff recovery. Recruitment and retention remain priorities in a tight labour market with efforts to explore new recruitment strategies and enhance the workplace experience to boost retention. Staff training continues to a key focus with work already underway following a recent external training needs analysis.

Our Finance and Administration team, along with Payroll, plays a crucial role in maintaining Kurrajong's financial stability and operational efficiency. They provide essential support through precise financial management and processing. An upcoming finance system upgrade will improve operational efficiency, streamline financial processes and enhance decision-making to meet evolving business needs.

Our Community Engagement Manager, Cathie Smith and Community Engagement Officer, Jane Pottie both retired in early July this year.


